

## Information about the Third International Conference of the East Asian Consortium of Japanese Studies

Founded in 2016 as an international academic exchange organization, the East Asian Consortium of Japanese Studies provides a home to Japanese studies specialists based in Japan, China, Taiwan and Korea. The Consortium was born of research activities led by the East Asian Forum of Japanese Studies, an international and interdisciplinary research workshop organized annually by voluntary supports of Japanese studies specialists since 2010. The members of its Steering Committee consist of 12 scholars in Japanese Studies across countries/regions in the East Asia. The Consortium held an international conference in Incheon (Korea) in 2016, and in Tianjin (China) for the year 2017, with each conference welcomed over 300 participants to present their papers and to exchange their ideas.

The third meeting will be held this year in Kyoto. Taking over the mission of the East Asian Forum of Japanese Studies, the Consortium aims to further facilitate the exchange of ideas among Japanese studies specialists in the East Asia. By holding the conference in Japan, we also hope to have more researchers based in Japan participating to the conference. As we did in the previous two conferences, the Consortium continues to encourage and support presentations of graduate students and early-career scholars.

As a general rule, participants are required to present and write abstracts/ papers in Japanese. However, this rule shall not apply for those who wish to present in languages other than Japanese if the participants arrange their interpreters.

- Travel expenses, accommodation fees: Participants are responsible to cover their own fees.

## HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Presenters are required to submit an abstract on related themes (maximum 800 characters in Japanese), either by organizing panels or by submitting individual paper proposals.

### Organized Panel Sessions

This panel session should consist of 4 – 7 members in total, including a chair, paper presenters and discussants.

### Individual Papers

The Organizing Committee will carefully review abstracts submitted as individual paper proposals and will form panels on related topics.

### The Next-Generation Panel Sessions

We also invite PhD students, PhD candidates with expected doctoral degree, and postdoctoral researchers based in Japan, China, Taiwan and Korea, to submit proposals for the Next-Generation Panel Sessions.
